

Fire Safety



Hover board — part toy, part transportation. These self-balancing scooters have quickly become the latest fad. However, many hover boards have been linked to fires. NFPA urges you to be fire safe when using these devices.

If you purchase a hover board

Choose a device with the seal of an independent testing laboratory.

 Read and follow all manufacturer directions. If you do not understand the directions, ask for help.

 An adult should be responsible for charging the hover board.

 Do not leave a charging hover board unattended.

• Never leave the hover board plugged in overnight.

• Only use the charging cord that came with the hover board.

Stop using your hover board if it overheats.

• Extreme hot or cold temperature can hurt the battery.

NEW TO MARKET

Hover boards are fairly new to the mass market. Be on the lookout for updates from manufacturers and safety groups.

Signs of a Problem

Some hover board fires have involved the Lithium-Ion battery or charger. Signs you could have a problem:

- Leaking fluids
- Excessive heat
- Odor
- Sparking
- Smoke

If you notice any of these signs, stop using the device right away.

Travel Notes

• Many airlines have banned hover boards. If you plan to fly with a hover board, be sure to check with your air carrier.

• When riding in a car, keep the hover board where you can see it in case it shows signs of a problem.

SENIOR SCAMS

Seniors lose billions of dollars every year to scams. Protecting our seniors starts with talking to them about different types of scams and how to avoid becoming a victim.

Popular Scam:

"The Grandparent or Family Emergency Scam"

How It Works:

* Senior gets a call from a person impersonating a grandchild or relative saying they have an emergency, i.e. they are in jail, their car broke down, been involved in an accident or kidnapped and they need money QUICK.

* At times they call at night to appear legitimate and/or have others in their story.

* They ask for Money to be wired to them immediately.

* They ask that it be kept a secret. For more info: Tarpon Springs Police Dept.





What Should I Do?

1. *Resist the urge to act immediately* No matter how dramatic the story.

2. Verify and ask questions

Ask hard questions for a stranger to guess.

Tell someone and call the person named to let them know what is happening to verify the information.

3. Report it
